Open air	Visit to Lumiar - neighbourhood in struggle
	Alta de Lisboa hosts most of the social housing estates that were built with the Special Resettlement Program of the 1990s, comprising around 5500 municipal homes. However, many of the apartments, managed by the city council, stand vacant (sometimes for years!) at the same time that there exists an acute housing crisis. Many families have candidated themselves for the municipal housing for years, without success. Habita therefore considers legitimate and supports the decision of many residents to occupy and habitate these apartments.  With this visit, we wish to support the struggle of these residents, who are mostly women and often single mothers. The purpose of the visit is to share practical experiences on how to defend occupations and stop evictions from social housing, and how to foster union among the residents that find themselves in this, often deeply stressful, situation.

Open air	Visit to Bairro da Torre - neighbourhood in struggle
	Bairro da Torre is a self-produced neighborhood located on the edge of Lisbon's airport, which results from the occupation of a public and partly private location, which origins dates back to the 1960s. In 2011, the Municipality of Loures (CML), under a Special Rehabilitation Program, began a process of demolition of the neighborhood, without any solution for many of the resident families that had not been included in the list held in 1993. Who was on the list was rehoused in neighborhoods, with the support of the Habita, his right to a housing with the CML, being able to remain in the neighborhood, in precarious conditions. In 2014, the Socio-territorial, Urban and Local Action Study Group (Gestual), Faculty of Architecture of the University of Lisbon, was contacted by Habita to collaborate in the search of housing and urban solutions for the current situation of the inhabitants, where about 48 families live. Based on a dialogue with the Association of Residents of the Neighborhood, with the Habita and with the CML Housing Department, the study of the situation of the neighborhood began, and there were also several cleaning and construction activities that their effective qualification and the reinforcement of the residents' self-esteem. However, this initiative was abruptly discontinued in October 2016, with EDP cutting off access to electricity and, more recently, in July of this year, with a major fire that left 35 people homeless. With this visit we want to support the struggle of these residents, sharing the experience of the activists: it would be important to discuss some urgent issues, among others: What is the future of Bairro da Torre? How to guarantee access to a decent housing? How to promote a participatory rehoming process? How to promote the union of the residents, in the face of the continuous and exhausting struggle of resistance?
